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Entry and Run Order Information

Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers or any other dog, including mixed breeds enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Females in season may not enter. A dog may enter only once per event (an event is defined by an event number).

Regular Entry: \$26.00 per dog

Junior Handler (one dog only) \$11.00

Entries close 6 PM PT, the Thursday before the events or when events fill. No day-of entries will be taken.

Junior Handlers are limited to entering one dog.

Entry Information

1. Only online entries will be accepted. No day of entries will be accepted.
2. Entry form will allow a dog to be entered in all four events. Fill out one form per dog.
3. **If you have entered a dog in a Chintimini Kennel Club CAT before, the form will autofill your dog's and your information from our database. Autofill works if the AKC number entered is EXACTLY what is in our database. YOU MUST USE CAPITALS for ALL LETTERS IN THE AKC NUMBER. AKC numbers come in two formats, 10 characters (e.g. AB12345678) or 9 characters (PAL123456). The autofill information can be updated by entering the correct information into the appropriate field.**
4. Payment is via credit card or Apple Pay. Follow directions for Apple Pay. Note if Apple pay link fails, the form will freeze and you must start again. Sorry!
5. Once your entry has been processed, we will email a list of dogs entered with their run-numbers, AKC Number and other entry information. Corrections must be emailed to the event secretary by Thursday, before the Event.

Refund Policy

1. Full refunds will be given for dog failing inspection at the event including female dogs in season.
2. Refunds given for entries withdrawn before closing will be given minus the service fee by Square. All service fees for credit/debit card transactions are included in the entry fee.
3. If closing occurs because of entry limits a refund will be given only if another entry is received to fill the vacancy.

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Event Schedule and Photographer Information

A handler's meeting will be held at the start of each day.

During the event, please proceed promptly to the paddock when your run number is announced. Dogs that do not report to the paddock when called will be moved to the end of the run order. Dogs not inspected within the allocated time will not be run.

Saturday Event 2026098831 and Sunday Event 2026098833:

8:30 AM—9:30AM – Inspection – All dogs must be inspected. Your run number for the first event of the day will be issued at inspection.

8:45 AM – Handler's Meeting 9:00 AM – Start of Runs.

Saturday Event 202632 and Sunday Event 2026098834:

Start of Runs - 15 Minutes after end of the first event each day. Dogs need to be inspected as they leave the field after their first run. Run numbers of the second event will be given at this second inspection.

DIRECTION TO SITE

From the South on I5:

Take Exit 199 towards Coburg National Historic District and turn left onto Van Duyn R. In 0.8 miles turn right onto N Willamette St. In 0.3 miles turn left onto W Van Durn St. In 0.2 miles turn right onto N Coburg Rd. In 6.1 miles field is on the right, 21561 N Coburg R. ALTERNATELY, stay on I5 and take Exit 209 towards Harrisburg, Junction City. The follow directions below.

From the North on I5

Take Exit 209 towards Harrisburg, Junction City. Turn right onto Diamond Hill Dr. towards Harrisburg. In 0.3 miles turn left onto N Coburg Rd. Field is 3.7 miles on your left. 21561 N Coburg Rd.

From 99E and Harrisburg

From 99E in Harrisburg turn onto LaSalle St towards East. LaSalle St is the first street north of the bridge crossing the Willamette River. In 0.3 miles turn right onto S Sixth St. In 3.1 miles turn left onto Bowers Rd. In 3.2 miles is N Coburg Rd, entrance to the field is 200 feet to the left of the junction of Bowers Rd. and N Coburg Rd.

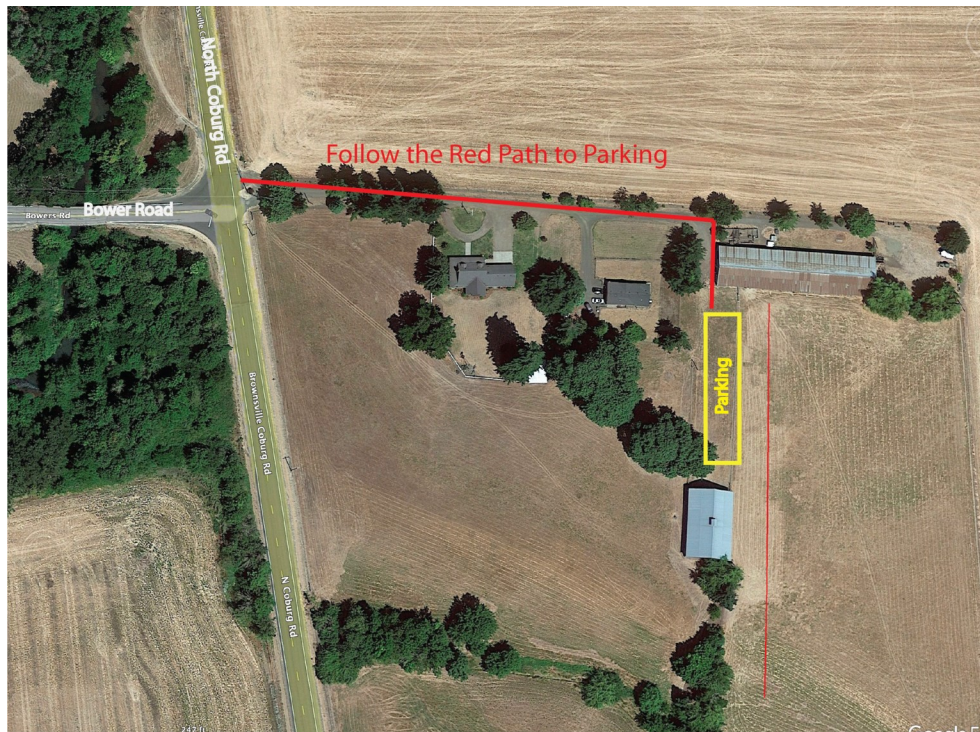

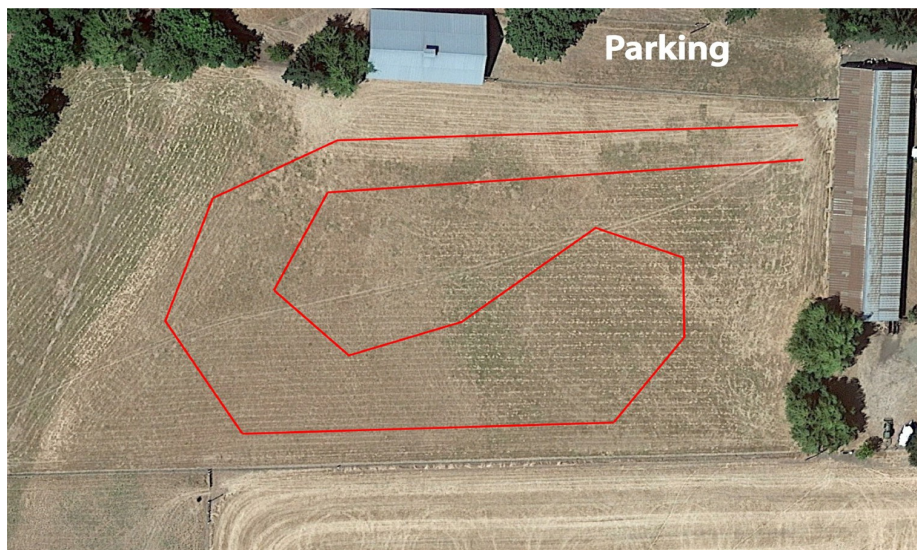

General

1. All entries must be one year of age or older on the day of the test or trial.
2. Dogs that have not arrived before the end of their Inspection Time as stated in the premium are considered ab- sent. And will be scratched. Exceptions to this rule are up to the Trial Secretary.
3. No refunds will be given for scratched dogs.
4. Each entry will be examined and may be measured with a wicket at inspection. Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees shall be refunded.
5. Dogs will be inspected before each event.
6. Entry fees shall be refunded for any entry that is withdrawn before entries close. Entries close Sept. 11th or when limits are reached. No refund will be given for dogs withdrawn after the close of entry.
7. Entry Numbers are based on order of the receipt of entry.
8. The Paddock Master will determine when any dog runs.
9. Dogs will be run by groups of Entry Numbers with the following exceptions:
 - Workers who are managing the event will be allowed to run their dogs out of order to fit their schedules.
 - Several handlers have multiple dogs. Commonly their dogs are listed in order. These dogs will be separated to allow handlers to walk their dogs out and retrieve the next dog.
 - If a dog is late for their run time or dogs that have been granted the opportunity for a rerun, they will run at the end of the running order or at the discretion of the Paddock Master.

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10. Reruns will be granted if a dog fails to run their first course because of machine problems or string breaks.
11. For safety reasons, it is preferred that dogs run “naked” without collars or harnesses. A flat collar with no dangling tags is acceptable. Harnesses are allowed to get the dog to the line, but for safety must be removed before the dog runs. Muzzles are allowed. No metal collars or retractable leads.
12. Electric continuous loop machines will be used. Lure will consist of white plastic bags.
13. The field committee reserves the right to alter the course plan as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the trial.
14. The field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive hounds from the event site.
15. There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose hound not taking part in the course in progress, or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving garbage on the field.
16. NO ONE will be allowed on the field without the express permission of the field chairman, except the appointed field committee.
17. Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action by AKC.
18. Control of dogs strictly enforced on leash at all times except when running.
19. Clean up and carry out all trash.
20. Please pick up all dog feces and remove with trash. DO NOT put dog waste in porta pots!

Handler Notes, Veterinarian and Area Information

Notes for First Time Handlers

SLIP LEADS—There is a type of collar for coursing called a slip lead, which is worn only to control the dog prior to re-lease. The collar drops away as the dog is released to chase the lure and they run without anything around their necks that could be dangerous. **Use of a slip lead is recommended but not required. What is important is that, for the safety of your dog, there are no objects on the dog that can be caught by the string or lure.**

INSPECTION—Dogs will be inspected by a designated Inspection Committee consisting of at least two persons who are members of the Field Committee and who shall inspect each entered dog for lameness, fitness to compete and female estrus (in season). Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the Inspection Committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete or in season shall not be allowed to enter and the applicable entry fees shall be refunded. Dogs must be inspected before each event to assess whether an injury occurred since the last inspection.

WARM-UP, COOL-DOWN—It is highly recommended that all dogs running are walked out for about 10-15 minutes prior to and after their runs to get them warmed up and to cool them down. The warmup helps reduce pulled muscles. The cool-down is very important to allow the dog's heart rate to slowly come to normal and because it helps prevent lactic acid build-up in the muscles that leads to soreness.

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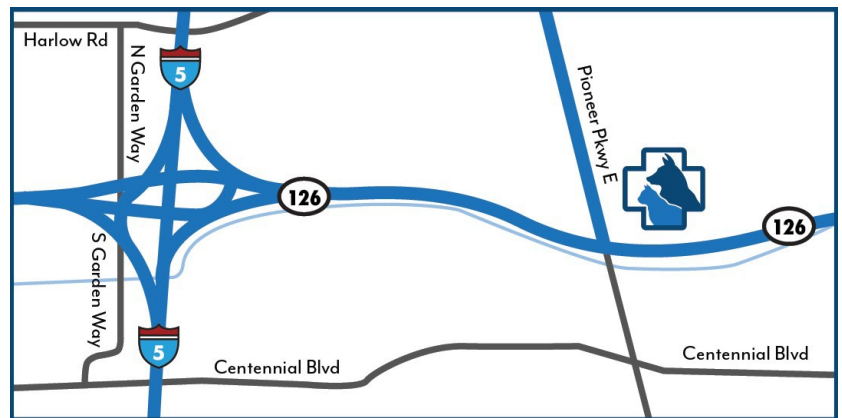

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General Coursing Ability Test Information

Ribbons & Prizes:

Orange flat ribbon for completion of Test.

Dogs completing CAT titles at these tests will receive a special rosette.

What Must A Dog Do To Pass The C.A.T.? The Coursing Ability Test (C.A.T.) is a pass/fail test. During a Test the dog runs the course once without any other dogs. Because safety is of the utmost importance, the C.A.T. takes into consideration the individual dog pursuing qualification and therefore has two different course lengths to accommodate the type and size of the entrant. In either case, dogs will chase a lure made of plastic strips.

Dogs Less Than 12" Tall & "Flat Faced" Dogs. Any entrant that is less than 12" tall at the withers and/or brachycephalic will run a 300-yard course with turns no more acute than 90 degrees. *For a 300-yard course, a dog must complete the test in less than 1 ½ minutes.*

Dogs More Than 12" Tall. Any entrant that is taller than 12" at the withers and not brachycephalic shall run a 600- yard course (or as close to 600 yards as possible) with turns no more acute than 90 degrees. *For a 600-yard course, a dog must complete the test in less than 2 minutes.*

Veteran Dogs. Veteran dogs are defined for this test as dogs older than 7 years of age. Veteran dogs may run two- thirds of the normal distance at the owner's discretion. A veteran dog's owner must declare prior to the start which distance the dog will run.

If there is a question which course a dog should run, the judge will decide.

In order to pass, the dog must complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption within the maximum amount of time for the course length. The judge keeps the official time and decides the merits of the dog's performance.

C.A.T. Titles: Three titles will be awarded for dogs that pass the Coursing Ability Test the required number of times. These are suffix titles that will appear on a dog's pedigree with a higher-level title superseding a lower level title.

Coursing Ability (CA) – Awarded to a dog that passes the Coursing Ability Test three times under at least two different judges.

Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA) - Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test ten times.

Coursing Ability Excellent (CAX) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test 25 times.

Coursing Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test 50 times. A higher numbered title will be awarded for every additional 25 passes.
